PALAZZO FALSON IS AN 800-YEAR OLD PALAZZO, A HOME TO NUMEROUS FAMILIES, AND WHICH NOW SERVES AS A HISTORIC HOUSE MUSEUM IN MDINA. THE LAST OWNER AND RESIDENT OF THIS PALAZZO WAS CAPTAIN OLOF GOLLCHER AND HIS WIFE NELLA, WHO ADORNED THEIR HOME WITH VARIED ANTIQUES AND CURIOUS COLLECTIONS. OLOF WAS A SEASONED TRAVELLER, AN AVID COLLECTOR, A RESEARCHER, A PHILANTHROPIST, AN ARTIST, AN ANIMAL LOVER, AND A PIONEER IN UNDERWATER ARCHAEOLOGY. THE STATELY ROOMS OF THE PALAZZO CAPTURE THE SPIRIT OF THIS DISTINGUISHED AND CHARMING MAN WHO BEQUEATHED HIS HOME AND COLLECTIONS FOR THE ENJOYMENT OF THE PUBLIC. OLOF WAS A CULTURALLY SENSITIVE MAN WHO WAS AHEAD OF HIS TIME. HIS LEGACY LIVES ON AT PALAZZO FALSON.

The children's activity book was developed from workshops that were inspired from our collection at the museum. These workshops helped children interact with the artefacts and learn more about them. We regularly hold these workshops for children (6-10 years) and have proved to be very popular with the public and schools. This activity book is intended to give a better understanding of our culture, art, and history in an interactive and fun manner. The activities have been designed to invite the children to interact with the artefacts before visiting the museum or as an extension of it. The activities are also useful as an online teachers' resource and for parents to educate and entertain their children.







































(FOR BEE-SHAPED BISCUITS)

4 CUPS ALL-PURPOSE FLOUR 480G

34 TSP SALT 3G

15 CUP CORNSTARCH 60G

2 STICKS BUTTER 220G, ROOM TEMP

1 CUP SUGAR 200G

2 EGGS

1 TSP VANILLA EXTRACT 5ML

METHOD

PREHEAT OVEN TO 375F.

SIFT FLOUR, SALT, CORNSTARCH INTO A MEDIUM BOWL.
GIVE IT A WHISK.

IN A STANDING MIXER FITTED WITH A PADDLE ATTACHMENT, CREAM THE BUTTER AND SUGAR TOGETHER UNTIL FLUFFY.

SCRAPE DOWN THE BOWL BEFORE ADDING EGGS.
ADD EGGS. MIX UNTIL COMBINED.

ADD DRY INGREDIENTS TO THE MIXTURE.

MIX ON LOW WITH A PADDLE ATTACHMENT.

DRIZZLE IN VANILLA. MIX UNTIL COMBINED.

TRANSFER DOUGH TO PARCHMENT PAPER.
ROLL INTO A DISK.

CHILL FOR ABOUT 1 HOUR.

PRESS TO FLATTEN AND ROLL BETWEEN 2 PIECES OF PARCHMENT PAPER.


ROLL DOUGH TO 1CM.

USING A CARDBOARD AS A MOULD DRAW THE SHAPE OF A BEE, THEN TRACE AND CUT THE BISCUIT WITH A SPOON/BUTTER KNIFE.


PLACE THE BISCUITS ONTO A BAKING SHEET.

BAKE FOR 12-15 MINUTES.


LET THE BISCUITS COOL BEFORE DECORATING.










FERDINAND THE BULL
